Students who are not admitted or are not admitted to a degree seeking program are not eligible to be awarded financial aid. Complete and submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA, 1-800-4-FED-AID) as soon as possible after **October 1** each year. Complete your FAFSA by November 1st for priority aid consideration. You may still complete your FAFSA even if you have NOT filed taxes. After filing, sign into your FAFSA and UPDATE your tax information by using the IRS Data Retrieval Tool.

You can complete the **FAFSA** and create your **FSA ID** online at www.fafsa.ed.gov.

To be considered for funds awarded through the EKU Financial Aid Office, you must:

- be enrolled at least half-time (except for Federal Pell Grant) in a program leading to a degree at EKU.
- maintain satisfactory academic progress as defined by the EKU Satisfactory Progress Standards.

After you submit your FAFSA/Renewal FAFSA, the federal processor will: 1)forward the FAFSA/renewal FAFSA information to the EKU Financial Aid Office, (2)send a Student Aid Report (SAR) to you at the address listed on your FAFSA/Renewal FAFSA.

EKU Now (Dual Credit)

Application Deadlines: Fall: June 15 - Spring : Nov 1

EKU's dual credit program is open to high school and home school juniors and seniors, residing in Kentucky, who meet the eligibility requirements, and whose school is partnering with EKU in this endeavor. This program provides the opportunity for high school juniors and seniors to enroll in EKU courses for dual credit - receiving college credit from EKU and high school credit from their high school.

To Qualify

- You must be a junior or senior in high school or home school residing in Kentucky.
 - You must have a high school GPA of 3.0 and ACT scores on file with EKU at the time you apply for the program.
 - You must have minimum ACT scores of 18 in English, 20 in Reading and a Composite ACT score of 20 at the time of application to the program* (\$53 per credit hour).
 - Your high school or home school must be a participating partner. (Check with your guidance counselor.)
- *KYOTE test scores may be substituted if ACT/PLAN sub-scores do not meet minimum requirements. SAT conversion scores will be determined by EKU.

Dual Credit Scholarships

Academically strong high school students may qualify for free dual credit tuition. All Dual Credit applications will be reviewed for scholarship qualification.

EKU Now! – EKU Dual Credit students with a 3.0 high school GPA, plus minimum ACT scores of 18 in English, 19 in Math, 20 in Reading and a 21 Composite are eligible to receive free dual credit tuition for **one of the two allotted courses per semester.**

Whitlock Scholar Candidate – EKU Dual Credit students with a 3.5 unweighted high school GPA and minimum ACT scores of 18 in English, 19 in Math, 20 in Reading and a 23 Composite are eligible to receive free dual credit tuition for the **two allotted courses per semester.**

1. Submit EKU Admission Application (available at EKU Manchester or online) and \$35 application fee.
2. Submit Official High School Transcripts or GED & ACT/SAT (residual ACT offered at Manchester) scores with application. (A final transcript will also need to be sent)
3. Once you are admitted, register for New Student Orientation (Advising, Placement Exams, and Class Registration).
4. Complete FAFSA (Financial Aid Form) after October 1, available online at www.fafsa.ed.gov.

Residual ACT

Test results are valid at EKU only and cannot be transferred to any other institution or agency. Test participants must wait 60 days between each Residual ACT examination.

All exams begin at 9:00 am & cost \$53

If EKU is on a two-hour delay, the exam will begin at 10:30 am

Exam fees must be paid at the time of registration (checks or money orders only). Students must register by 8:00 pm on the night prior to the test date. Study guides are available at the Manchester Campus or www.act.org.

First Steps:

1. Apply for **admission**.
2. Request that your previous colleges/universities send your official transcripts directly to the Office of Admissions.
3. Apply for **financial aid**.
4. Check your eligibility for a **transfer scholarship**.

- In addition to submitting the application for admission, ask the Registrar of each regionally accredited college and/or university you have attended — and the high school guidance counselor, if you have completed less than 24 semester hours of college work — to send an official transcript of your record directly to the Office of Admissions. An official transcript is defined as having the seal of the college or university and the signature of the registrar. The transcript must be sent directly to EKU's admission office.

- To transfer to EKU, you must have a minimum cumulative GPA of at least 2.0 (4.0 scale) on all work attempted at regionally accredited institutions. In addition, you should be eligible to return to each institution you previously attended. Applicants not meeting these conditions should contact the Office of Admissions at 859-622-2106 or 800-465-9191.

- Students, who do not meet the above criteria, particularly non-traditional students, and who have not been enrolled in a college or university for a minimum period of 2 years may apply for admission under the provisions of EKU's academic bankruptcy policy. Please contact the Office of Admissions for information at 859-622-2106 or 800-465-9191.

- ACT scores are not required for admission as a transfer student unless you have completed fewer than 24 semester hours of college work; however you are strongly encouraged to submit scores for proper course placement and/or to establish your proficiency in the basic skills of English, mathematics, and reading.
