Students who are not admitted or are not admitted to a degree seeking program are not eligible to be awarded financial aid. Complete and submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA, 1-800-4-FED-AID) as soon as possible after **October 1** each year. Complete your FAFSA by November 1st for priority aid consideration. You may still complete your FAFSA even if you have NOT filed taxes. After filing, sign into your FAFSA and UPDATE your tax information by using the IRS Data Retrieval Tool.

You can complete the FAFSA and create your FSA ID online at www.fafsa.ed.gov.

To be considered for funds awarded through the ECU Financial Aid Office, you must:

- be enrolled at least half-time (except for Federal Pell Grant) in a program leading to a degree at ECU.
- maintain satisfactory academic progress as defined by the ECU Satisfactory Progress Standards.

After you submit your FAFSA/Renewal FAFSA, the federal processor will: 1) forward the FAFSA/renewal FAFSA information to the ECU Financial Aid Office, (2) send a Student Aid Report (SAR) to you at the address listed on your FAFSA/Renewal FAFSA.

EKU Now (Dual Credit)

Program Changes Beginning Fall 2019 – To qualify, students will be required to have a **3.0 grade point average** (weighted or unweighted) and **meet college readiness in English** (ACT 18 in English, equivalent KYOTE, ECU Placement Test scores, ENG 101 AP credit or ECU ENG 101 equivalent transfer credit). To apply, go to www.dualcredit.eku.edu and follow the instructions. Additionally, the Study Strong Scholarship (EKU freshman award) will replace the ECU Now! and Whitlock Scholar Candidate scholarship award programs. The Study Strong Scholarship cannot be used to pay for dual credit classes. In order to get your dual credit class paid for, dual credit students will need to utilize the **KHEAA Dual Credit Scholarship** program or the **KHEAA Work Ready Kentucky Scholarship** program. Orientation/Registration – All Dual Credit students must attend Orientation prior to registering for classes. Register for either July 29 at 12 pm or August 5 at 12 pm at <https://dualcredit.eku.edu/advising-registration-manchester>.

How much will it cost? The 2019-20 tuition is \$58 per credit hour, **(\$174 for a 3 credit-hour course)**. This is a savings of \$328 per credit hour (a savings of \$984 for a 3 credit hour course) from undergraduate tuition. However, All students must purchase their own textbooks (including digital textbooks), course materials and parking passes, if applicable regardless of KHEAA Scholarship status.

Can I take more than one course per semester? Qualifying juniors and seniors may enroll in a maximum of 2 courses per semester (fall and spring) at dual credit tuition rates (maximum of 8 courses total). The **Study Strong Scholarship** is for students who earn dual credit through ECU. Students can virtually double their investment, earning up to \$2,400 additional scholarship dollars* for getting good grades and bringing those credits to ECU. Students taking Advance Placement (AP) can also earn dollars* for their test-score earned credits.

Earn up to \$300 per course/exam score credit:

EKU Dual Credit Course

A = \$300 B = \$225 C = \$150

Advance Placement (AP) Exam Score

5 = \$300 4 = \$225 3 = \$150

**One time award to high schools seniors who enroll as new freshmen at ECU in the first fall term following their graduation from high school. Maximum award \$2,400, in addition to any Merit Scholarships earned. Total aid cannot exceed cost of attendance, in such cases institutional awards, such as Study Strong, may be reduced.*

Admission Checklist

1. Submit ECU Admission Application (available at ECU Manchester or online) and \$35 application fee.
2. Submit Official High School Transcripts or GED & ACT/SAT (residual ACT offered at Manchester) scores with application. (A final transcript will also need to be sent)
3. Once you are admitted, register for New Student Orientation (Advising, Placement Exams, and Class Registration).

Test results are valid at EKU only and cannot be transferred to any other institution or agency. Test participants must wait 60 days between each Residual ACT examination.

All exams begin at 9:00 am & cost \$63

First Steps:

1. Apply for **admission**.
2. Request that your previous colleges/universities send your official transcripts directly to the Office of Admissions.
3. Apply for **financial aid**.
4. Check your eligibility for a **transfer scholarship**.

- In addition to submitting the application for admission, ask the Registrar of each regionally accredited college and/or university you have attended — and the high school guidance counselor, if you have completed less than 24 semester hours of college work — to send an official transcript of your record directly to the Office of Admissions. An official transcript is defined as having the seal of the college or university and the signature of the registrar. The transcript must be sent directly to EKU's admission office.

- To transfer to EKU, you must have a minimum cumulative GPA of at least 2.0 (4.0 scale) on all work attempted at regionally accredited institutions. In addition, you should be eligible to return to each institution you previously attended. Applicants not meeting these conditions should contact the Office of Admissions at 859-622-2106 or 800-465-9191.

- Students, who do not meet the above criteria, particularly non-traditional students, and who have not been enrolled in a college or university for a minimum period of 2 years may apply for admission under the provisions of EKU's academic bankruptcy policy. Please contact the Office of Admissions for information at 859-622-2106 or 800-465-9191.

- ACT scores are not required for admission as a transfer student unless you have completed fewer than 24 semester hours of college work; however you are strongly encouraged to submit scores for proper course placement and/or to establish your proficiency in the basic skills of English, mathematics, and reading.
